



Bramley Bulletin – 24th November 2023

I hope this newsletter finds you well and in good spirits. It has been an incredibly exciting and eventful month here at Bramley C of E Primary, and I am delighted to share with you some of the highlights.

Last Thursday, I was having one of those days; the rain was coming down, I had a long day ahead with a late Governors meeting, it was getting dark early as I drove towards Bramley from Whitewater at 4pm. My spirits were soon lifted as I walked into my office and found a selection of drawings and crafts with notes on them saying 'To Mr Moore'. I went on to find out that our Year R pupils had been spreading happiness by 'filling up the buckets' of other people. What a wonderful way to spread kindness!



What is going on in school?

Penny and Blake in EYFS said... "we have been learning about the number 5 and using cubes to make it in different ways. Today we were cutting out and colouring aliens because we were singing the alien song (5 Little Men in a Flying Saucer). Our Christmas play is going to be really good because we get to do lots of singing and dancing. And my costume is really cool (Blake)."

Avery and Finley in year 1 said... "in class we have been drawing shapes and then cutting them out. We have been cutting them in half - we have to look to see if they are the same size and the same amount. We are learning about doctors and soon a paramedic is coming to our class to talk to us. Some people get sick in winter and we had to get a tickle in our nose to help stop us from getting poorly (our flu 'jabs'). The stickers we got smelled nice!"

Jacob and Rosie in year 2 said... "in our writing we have been using The Journey story and writing it in our own words. We have to use ? and ! for our speech or thought bubbles to show what characters are saying and thinking. The soldiers are grumpy and shout at the girl because she stole the bird and let it go. We had the fire crew in our class and they told us how serious it was to call 999 and to only do it in an emergency. There are 4 different emergency vehicles and they told us when we could call the different ones in different kinds of emergencies. In our Christmas play, there is lots of singing and acting – we love the songs."

Amelie and Ellis in year 3 said... "in art we have been sketching fossils and rocks then we made them out of clay. Then we made 'dinosaur' footprint fossil out of salt dough, it was quite hard to mix the dough. We have learnt about different kinds of rocks like metamorphic, sedimentary and igneous – these are made after volcanoes erupt. We used all of this learning to make a fact page all about the rocks using all the conjunctions we have been learning to join the facts together." (The children were fantastic at sharing how the rocks were different from each other).

Marcus and Maddie in year 4 said... "we are making shields out of cardboard by putting Roman imprints on them and looking at different styles from the Roman Empire. We will get to use them in our Roman Day on Monday – we will be wearing Roman costumes! In our writing we have been using the story The Comet all about a girl who is really sad when she moves house, we are at the part where she saw a comet fall from the sky and a tree sprouted out of it. We are going to write what we think is going to happen to the girl – using our prepositions and expanded noun phrases to add detail – then we will get to read the book ending!"

George and Evie in year 5 have written... In maths, we have been doing division using the bus stop method. Lots of people have been in the pit but they have been a resilient racoon and kept going. In English we are writing about the moon landings and if they were real or not. There are lots of debates around the moon landings and we have looked at different bits of evidence. Our science work is all about space this term, we have looked at the planets and learnt about Tim Peake's time in space.

Freddie and Caoimhe in year 6 have written... Our topic is Epic Explorers, which includes Ernest Shackleton, Amelia Earhart and lots more. We have been learning facts about Ernest Shackleton's life and the places he went so we could write biographies about him. In maths we've been learning about fractions and how to order them from smallest to largest. During our computing lessons, we have been making our own games on Scratch, where we use code to programme the computer.

Our New Values...

Within our whole school worship over the last few weeks, we have been discussing the importance of each element of our new school values. Supporting the children to understand what we are striving for is so important in guiding their behaviour choices towards others and for themselves.
