As we rapidly approach the Easter break, school continues to be a hive of activity. The last fortnight has seen a whole load of sport, more fund-raising, outcome events and school trips and there's still more to squeeze in. I hope you enjoy reading what we've been up to and what's still to come.

What is going on in school?

Mrs Bellemere says...

This week we have been learning about different plants. We have looked at the book 'The Big Book of Blooms' and have focused on Venus flytraps, poisonous plants, cacti, and have also talked about flowers we can drink and eat.

We have talked about what insects are attracted to which flowers. The children have absolutely loved learning about the Venus flytraps, including watching a video about how the flytrap works. This has led to the children building their own flytraps out of construction, writing about bugs and traps, and drawing the fly traps. We managed to get one from the local garden centre and have enjoyed being able to see what they are like in real life – they are not as scary as we thought! This past weeks learning has made the children so inquisitive and curious - they have been so inspired that they have produced amazing pieces of artwork, writing, crafts and construction models. We feel very proud of their learning this week in EYFS!



Miss Barrett says...

The year 1 children loved sharing their topic learning about Amazing Aviation for their outcome event this week! They used skills taught in DT to create their own journey using a sliding aeroplane and then wrote a story to accompany

their journey. They picked landmarks from capital cities and drew, coloured and labelled them. The children have also loved learning how to programme using Lego Wedo this week in their computing lessons. They had to build an object and then use algorithms to change the colours on their creation using the iPads. In Maths, the children loved measuring using objects and had a challenge to find the longest item in the classroom to measure.

In Year 2, we had a dragon invasion on Monday! When we came back to the classroom, it was pitch black and dragon noises were playing. Flamethrottle, a ferocious dragon, was terrorising the town so we wrote a job advert to find a brave knight to help defeat the dragon. The children's imaginative and more structured writing skills are coming



along so well! In Maths, we have been learning about time and fractions of shape/amounts over the last few weeks. We have become much more confident telling the time to the nearest 15 minutes too! Last week in DT, we designed and made cushions by sewing two pieces of felt together, the children then decorated them. This took a huge amount of resilience and determination for year 2 when doing this – we are so proud of them!



Miss Denham says...



Year 3 have had great fun exploring their topic. They become mummification masters by learning all the steps needed to make a mummy and loved mummifying their teddies. Linked to their work on Ancient Egyptian burial rites, the children have designed and are making their own canopic jars. These jars stored some of the mummies organs ready for the afterlife. In DT, they have made their own mini-shadufs. These are handoperated device for lifting water. They really need to think how they were going to join their pieces of wood and ensure they had a counter weight.

In Year 4, we have been doing science. The children created simple, parallel and series circuits. They drew them scientifically using symbols. They investigated which materials were insulators and conductors and discovered metals made good conductors. We used our

knowledge of circuits to make a simple torch by making a complete circuit with a battery, copper tape and a bulb. In History, the children have been learning about the different aspects of Mayan life, including farming and society. We found out about pok-a-tok, the Mayan ball game and even played a version of the game themselves.

What an exciting few weeks we have had in Year 5! The children are thoroughly enjoying turning their story ideas into magical plays. They are certainly practising their Collaborative Clownfish learning behaviour as well as our Reflective Rhino to support their group work! The children are so excited to share their efforts at performances to their parents next week. In Science, the children have been looking at different states materials can be – solids, liquids and gases. We have also begun to investigate how solids dissolve into liquids to make mixtures. We have really stepped up our learning in the last couple of weeks and the children are pushing themselves and their skills. Great work everyone! In Year 6, the children have continued to enjoy their Groovy Greeks topic. We have been reading and enjoying a range of Greek Myths, which have then helped the children to write their own. The mythical creatures and adventures they have imagined have been fantastic – really showing a breadth of imagination! We are also really proud with how they

are applying a range of writing skills to different pieces – this is really tricky and they are really pushing themselves! Keep up the hard work!

In art, the children have designed, made and painted their own greek clay pots. The end products look very effective. Our children are also forunate to be having gymnastics training from Miss Hammond at the moment, they are really pushing their core skills and strength with her routines.



Comic Relief...

Last Friday was Comic Relief. At school, we marked the day with the children coming to school in red and with a Mile Run. The children looked great and as always, their enthusiasm on the running track is brilliant! As a community, we raised £467 towards this cause. That's a total of nearly £6000 we've raised this term for charities. That's an incredible amount which will help so many people across the world.
