


# What are we learning?

# Communication & Language and Personal, Social & Emotional development

#### **Physical Development**

- \*Explore moving in lots of different ways using the Hampshire guidance to develop core muscle skills
- \* Develop their skills in handling tools and objects, construction and managing malleable materials safely and with increasing control
- \* Create obstacle courses and use the bikes in our outdoor area.
- \* Explore the forest school area and take manageable risks.

# Understanding of the World

- \*Exploring who they are within their community,
- \*Beginning looking at other cultures and religions within our class and cohort,
- \*Discussing how food gets from the fields to our plates through reading stories and learning songs about harvest.

#### **Mathematics**

- \*Exploring numbers up to 5 and what they mean,
- \*Discussing how each number can be shown in different pictures and patterns, and use different resources to show numbers,
- \*Learning what the number looks like as a numeral; how it can sound when it is clapped and how it compares to other numbers.
- \*Share new language such as 'more than', 'fewer than' and 'subitising'.

# Literacy

- \* Learn Phase 2 sounds using the Little Wandle phonics scheme this includes the sounds and letter shape of most individual letters,
- \*Develop their fine motor skills to enable them to begin writing some letters and also their own name,
- \*Explore a range of fiction and non-fiction books, including some about emotions, particularly around starting school, trying new things and some linked to harvest.

### Expressive Arts & Design

- \* Learn a variety of songs and begin to develop an awareness of the pitch and tone of different melodies,
- \* Explore a variety of instruments and will use those to replicate familiar songs and express their feelings and ideas,
- \* Create artwork for the classroom such as portraits of themselves.

### Maths

- \* Composition of numbers up to 20
- \*Learning how to add and subtract up to 20
- \*Measurement looking at the language we used when describing length and height,
  - \*Beginning to count coins.
