Ways to celebrate our Children

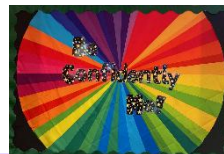
Many children have keen interests and busy lives outside school that they may want to share in school. The main way to do this would be with their class, this could be a conversation and showing a certificate or photo of something they have done with their class teacher, or sharing it with their whole class.

If it is a big achievement that they have worked hard towards or that matches one of our school values, they may want to show medals or share their achievements in our weekly Celebration assemblies. *It is often handy if an adult writes a summary for teachers in school as sometimes getting finer details from the children can be a bit tricky.*



Making a Difference

Children may have taken part in a charity event to help local or global causes - this could be a beach tidy, raising money to support a good cause or raising awareness of an issue that is important to them.



Being Confidently Me

This could be sharing something that they have worked hard towards or that has taken a long time to achieve – such as a gymnastics competition or a piano exam.

Showing Kindness to All

Children might take part in a litter pick to support their local community and protect the environment, or help a neighbour with their shopping. They could also be taking on a 'leadership' role at scouts or guides.





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House Captains

Within school, there are many roles children can take on to ***Make a difference*** and ***Be confidently me*** – next Friday, we will hold our annual elections to vote for the Year 6 Captains for each of our houses. The Year 6 children who would like to take on the role will be busy writing their speeches to encourage others to vote for them.

We ask all of the children in Yr1-6 to come into school next Friday in their school uniform, but swapping their usual t-shirt for one in their house colours – like we do for sports day – we hope this will unify the houses when they come together to make their votes. If you do not have a t-shirt in the correct colour, children should wear their normal school uniform.

We are excited to hear the children's speeches and see who our House Captains are for this year!
