Lunchtime equipment	£3,000	To enable greater active participation with sport at lunchtime and to resource the planned activities that form part of our lunchtime provision vision.	Order varied lunchtime equipment which is suitable for both KS1/2 children. Gather suggestions from lunchtime staff members.
