Morning Routines



Children need to be on time and ready to learn
– morning tasks 'warm them up' ready for the day.

Doors open $8:30 - 8:40 \rightarrow go$ through the office if they are late

Register is taken at 8:45.

Attendance – we aim for 96%. Anything below 90% is classified as *persistently absent*.

Lunches on the board daily - there is a three week timetable. Additionally, there is the option of a Jacket potato with various toppings or a cheese/ham sandwich.

Children can order in the morning or preferably pre-order through Scopay.

All children must bring in a named water bottle.

Presentation



Each day, we expect the children to come into school wearing the Bramley School Uniform.

School jumpers/cardigans and coats must be named.

This has not changed since last year – we have several children with trainers that are not plain black.

Many children without school jumpers. School Uniform Swap Shop – have lots of jumpers and cardigans

Forest School – one class will go each half term to forest school.

You will receive a parent mail in advance of your child's turn.

Please have a puddle suit and welly boots ready.

Long hair (boys and girls) should be tied back at all times – avoid distractions from work and for hygiene.

Earrings – should be small studs and easily removable for PE OR covered with tape before coming into school.

School Uniform

Trousers, Skirt or Pinafore Dress	-	Navy, black or grey; blue and white gingham check dress in summer
Shirt or Polo Shirt	-	White
Jumper/Cardigan	-	School sweatshirt/cardigan
Footwear	-	Plain, sensible, black, low heeled shoes or plain <u>black</u> trainers (without any markings)

PE Days are: Tuesday and Thursday



Children wear their PE kits into school on their set days.

Navy shorts with a plain/school light blue PE Shirt (not football tops or with logos)
- plain navy or black tracksuits bottoms in colder weather.

School fleece, hoodie or School jumper/cardigan (not plain blue hoodies)

– look like school uniform

If your child is wearing earrings, these need to be taped up before school.

Classes complete Mile Runs on other days – children can run in trainers or walk quickly in school shoes. Children can bring in trainers in their school bags to change into for their Mile Run if they wear school shoes.

Rewards and Consequences

We use a range of methods to reward behaviour, attitude, effort and achievements in school.

Verbal praise Comments in books House Points

Bronze, Silver and Gold Stickers → Behaviour Certificates in Assembly

Sharing with another adult, Mrs Hanson or Mr Moore

Celebration Assemblies

Children are given lots of support within lessons to complete their learning and achieve their best. If they don't complete their tasks, on occasion they may need to complete their work at break or lunchtime.

If children's behaviour or attitudes fall below our expectations, they may need to work with a member of the Senior Leadership Team to discuss their behaviour, with the aim to help them to put it right and change their behaviour for the future.

We will also contact parents to discuss events to work together with the child.

Learning at Home



As a school, we set tasks to continue children's learning at home. Tasks will always be set on a Friday (stuck into their purple book), to be completed and brought into school the following Wednesday.

Phonics/ Spelling: set words/ sounds to practise and learn

Maths: TTRS log in for all children- can access TTs and number facts (Numbots)

Homework should not be a battle or take an unreasonable amount of time – if your child is struggling or has taken a long time over a task, please write a brief note in the homework book to let the class teacher know.

If your child has a specific learning need that affects them completing homework, please speak to your child's class teacher.

Reading Diaries



Reading is a key skill which affects children in all aspects of their learning and lives.

We ask that children read for at least 10 minutes, 5 times a week.

This should be recorded in reading Diaries and signed by home adults to confirm it has taken place.

Diaries are checked in school every Thursday.

Our Reading Race rewards children and classes who strive to improve their skills through regular reading.

Little Wandle



Many children will continue working through the Little Wandle scheme. The scheme starts with a recap of phase 3 & 4 before beginning phase 5.

All year 1 children will be on LW. Some year 2 children will also be doing LW based on our assessments.

Book changes will be on a Thursday or Friday.

Children will not be given their new book if their previous book hasn't been returned.

There is a £5 charge for lost books. No charge for damage – please return even if there's an accident!

Reading after Little Wandle



Children who have come off the LW scheme will be bringing home a **turquoise** level book. They can change their book whenever they wish throughout the week. We encourage the children to have read the book at least twice at home with an adult.

We will bench mark them throughout the year and move them up a book band once they have achieved the assessment.
